Royal Melbourne the first Public Hospital live on THELMA's eClaims

The Royal Melbourne Hospital has become the first public hospital in Australia to send private patient hospital claims electronically to health funds after successfully integrating their HOMER patient management system to THELMA.

The Royal Melbourne Hospital is part of Melbourne Health, Victoria's second largest public health service, with 1,200 beds across inpatient, community and residential services.

The link to the HOMER system positions THELMA for rapid rollout of electronic claims to other public hospitals across Victoria and South Australia.

THELMA now has sophisticated electronic connections into the four major hospital patient management systems in Australia, the other three being PiMs, BJS and IBA, which cover approximately 85% of the private hospital market.
